Elizabeth Barth - Lastly, I nominate and appoint my trusty
friend John Dunn my whole and sole Executor of this my last
Will and Testament fully to carry the same into ample effect
and to see that its contents are duly enforced, hereby revoking and
rendering Null and Void all and every former Will or Wills that
I may have made, ratifying this and no other to be my last
Will and Testament - In witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this twentyfifth day of July 1796.

THE WILL OF THOMAS BREWSTER, 1798

son of Fluvanna County being declared of Being yet of sound and
perfect mind and memory do constitute and ordain this my
last Will and Testament in manner and form following to wit
First - I desire that all my just debts be paid

Item I lend unto my beloved wife Ellen Brewster during her
natural life or widowhood the Tract of land whereon I now live
Also eight Negroes, to wit Grace, Tall, Dick, Sam, Abby, Patsy,
Jonah, and Mary. also all my Stock of every kind and all the
cash and Tobacco I have now in hand.

Item - I give and bequeath unto my son Reuben Brewster
the Tract of land whereon he now liveth to him and his heirs forever

Item. I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Bettye Lefi
Twenty three pounds 16/8 to be paid out of my Estate within

twelve months after my death

Item - I give and bequeath unto my two Sons James and William

Brewster a feather Bed and furniture each, and twenty pounds
in Cash each, to be delivered to them whenever they shall marry

Item - I give and bequeath unto my three daughters Ellen
Brewster, Milly Brewster and Lucy Brewster a feather Bed
and furniture each also Thirty three pounds six shillings and eight
pence each, to be delivered to them as they marry.

Item - I give unto my two Sons James and William Brewster
(after my wifes death or marriage) the Tract of land whereon I now
live (which I mean to include all the lands I possess except the
Tract given to my son Reuben) to them and their heirs forever

Item. My will and desire is that my Son William shall have
a likely house saddle and bridle furnished him out of my Estate

Item. After my wifes death or Marriage all my Estate left
to her (except my land) together with their future increase I give to

Be equally divided among all my children to wit:
Auben, Betty, James Eller, Sally Day and William to them
and their heirs forever. But if any of my said children should
die without lawful issue my will and desire is that their part
of my estate hereby given to them should return and be equally
divided among my surviving children. And I do hereby ap-
