their last years hire respectively and to Jack I give all my wearing
apparel of every description. Item, I give and bequeath the residue
of all my property of all kinds and denominations to my daughter
Elizabeth Barthe - Lastly, I nominate and appoint my trusty
friend John Dunn my whole and sole Executor of this my last
Will and Testament fully to carry the same into ample effect
and to see that its contents are duly enforced, hereby revoking and
rendering Null and Void all and every former Will or Wills that
I may have made, ratifying this and no other to be my last
Will and Testament - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this twentieth day of July 1796.

On the 10th of Sept, 1798, I James Broad-
son of Fluvanna County being diseased of Body yet of sound and
perfect mind and memory do constitute and ordain this my
last Will and Testament in manner and form following to wit
First - I desire that all my just debts be paid

Item - I leave unto my beloved Wife Ellen Broadson during her
natural life or Widowhood the Tract of land whereon I now live
Also eight Negroes, to wit: Grace, Salt, Dick, Sam, Aggy, Victory,
Tenah, and Masey, also all my Stock of every kind and all the
cash and Tobacco I have now in hand.

Item - I give and bequeath unto my son Reuben Broadson
the Tract of land whereon he now lives to him and his heirs forever

Item - I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Betty Reff
twenty three pounds 16/8 to be paid out of my Estate within
twelve Months after my death.

Item - I give and bequeath unto my two Sons James and William
Broadson a feather Bed and furniture each, and twenty pounds
in cash each, to be delivered to them whenever they shall marry.

Item - I give and bequeath unto my three daughters Ellen
Broadson, Milley Broadson and Lucy Broadson a feather Bed
and furniture each also Thirty three pounds six shillings and eight
pence each, to be delivered to them as they marry.

Item - I give unto my two Sons James and William Broadson
(after my Wife's death or marriage) the Tract of land whereon I now
live (which I mean to include all the land I possess except the
Tract given to my son Reuben) to them and their heirs forever

Item - My will and desire is that my son William shall have
a likely horse saddle and bridle furnished him out of my Estate

Item - After my wife's death or marriage all my Estate left
to her (except my share) together with their future increase I give to

Be equally divided amongst all my Children to wit:
 Reuben, Betty, James Ellen, Hester, Lucy and William to them
 and their heirs forever. And if any of my said Children should
 die without lawful issue my will and desire is that their part
 of my estate hereby given to them should return and be equally
 divided among my surviving Children. And I do hereby ap-
 point my two sons Reuben and James Executors of
 this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and Seal this 19th day of April 1798.
