The Will of James Rags.

In the name of God: Amen.

I James Rags of the Seven Islands, Fluvanna County,
Virginia - being of Sound mind, tho' enfeebled by a lingering
illness, declare this Instrument to be my Last Will and
Testament - Making Void all and every Will heretofore made.

Having turned out first in life in the service; and -
assistance of my Brother Daniel Rags late of the West
Indies, in the Management of his Estate there, and
afterwards during the Revolutionary War, removed to
Virginia and rendered similar services to my Brother
Daniel Rags and the whole prime of my life was zealously

Desires to the large and comfortable of the late business,
at the expiration of which time, I became desirous of returning
from the busy scenes of a Public life, to that of a more rural and
contemplative kind. - therefore in the year of 1784. these
two Brothers as a compensation for my services, entered each
int. a Special Obligation of an Annuity to me of one Hundred
and fifty Pounds Sterling money to be paid annually at
the City of Glasgow in Great Brittain. - The Payment of this
Annuity however, was not regularly performed and of course I
was obliged to return to Virginia, since which time, partial,
but small advances have been made me, from time to
time by David Aps; and altho Daniel Aps, prior to his
decease had deposited in the hands of David Aps a con-
siderable property to be subject to his future Orders. -
Yet there has been nothing paid to me on account of
Daniel Aps, exclusive of the above claims. I have loaned
to David Aps some monies which I have receipts. -
My Brother David Aps employed me in a Voyage to
Great Brittain in quest of Antiquaries and Mechanicks
the monies therefore received and expended by me in that
Expedition, should not be brought to my Acc^t proper.
In the first place I desire that all my Just and law-
full Debts be paid. - Item I give and bequeath unto
Nelly Wilson and Elizabeth Wilson all my house hold
furniture to be divided between them and their heirs and assigns.

After my Just and Lawfull Debts are paid I desire that the
residue of my Estate both real and personal may be -
Equally divided between James, Nelly and Elizabeth
Wilson - their Heirs and Assigns. - I desire that my
accounts with my Brother David Aps may be settled, allowing him
a reasonable rent for the plantation at the Seven Islands,
for the time I have resided thereon, which with other advances
is to be deducted from the Annuity, the year they were specially
made, and the residue of the Annuity to bear Interest in the
usual and common mode of settling Annuities. -

Item - I give and bequeath unto James Wilson, Nelly
Wilson and Elizabeth Wilson, And to their Heirs and Assigns
the remainder and remainders of the Annuities (due from
David and Daniel Aps before named) to be equally divided
between them for the Sole living and benefit of their growing
families. - Item - It is my Will and desire that my
faithfull servant Woman Jemima may be forthwith
emancipated and taken care of by my Executors - This woman
is now upwards of fifty years of age, and whilst the property
of my Brother David, became lame and decripp'd. And
altho no price was ever mentioned by either of us, yet I
desire that she should be paid from the time she was
sent to me by him; her Valuation should be extremely
