fifth day of May 1792 I William Priddy of the
County of Fluvanna being very sick and weak in
Body but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be
given to God; therefore calling unto mind the mortality
of my Body, and knowing that it is appointed for
all men once to die, do make and ordain this my
last Will and Testament, that is to say principally
and first of all I give and recommend my soul into
the Hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my
Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in
decent Christian burial at the discretion of my
Executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrec-
tion I shall receive the same again by the mighty
power of God. And as touching such worldly

In this life, I give, devise and bequeath of the same in
the following manner and form. First I will and
bequeath unto my wife all my real and personal
Estate enduring her life, or widowhood.
I will and bequeath to my beloved Son George my
Mill after my Wife decease, and thirty Acres of
Land joining the Mill. Item I will and be-
queath all my personal and Real Estate that
remains to be equally divided after my lawful debts
are paid among six Children as follows Mary &
Judith and John, Milly and Perry and William
reducing five pounds a piece out of Judith and
William's part to be divided among the other four
children my said Son

I likewise appoint my beloved wife Jane
and my Son George Executors of this my
last Will and Testament.
