Item I give and bequeath unto my Sons John and Obadiah the remainder of that plantation mentioned to them and their Heirs forever an John paying fifteen pounds to my Estate to be divided as followeth John to have that part lying on the Laggan fork Obadiah to have that part that lies on the Great Branch of John should choose either to keep his fifteen pounds then have the land I then empower my Executors to sell his part and the amount of said Sale to be equally divided as the rest of my Estate above mentioned. Lastly I make constitute and ordain and appoint my beloved wife, John Maston and William Basket my Executors of this my last Will
