 mentioned to them and their Heirs forever an John paying fif-
 teen pounds to my Estate to be divided as followeth John to have
 that part lying on the happen fork Obadiah to have that part
 that lies on the Great Branch of John should choose whether to
 keep his fifteen pounds then have the land I then empower my
 Executors to sell his part and the amount of said Sale to be equally
 divided as the rest of my Estate above mentioned. Lastly I make
 constitute and ordain and appoint my beloved wife, John
 Maston and William Basket my Executors of this my last will
