Such by all persons — After all my lawfull Debts are
 paid (Item) the first — first I lend to my Wife Mary all my
 Estate Real and personal during ^{her} Natural life or widowhood
 Item the 2nd next I give to my Daughter Alice Jarvis one
 Feather Bed and Furniture one cow and one Negro woman
 named Sarah and one girl named Bet all of which is now
 in her possession —

Item the 3rd next I give to my Daughter Nancy Jarvis one
 Negro girl named Murren, one Feather Bed and Furniture
 and one cow all of which is now in her possession —

Item the 4th next I lend to my Daughter Susanna Hughes
 (during her Natural life) one Negro woman named Abby, but
 if she should die without issue, should age without issue, I
 desire for Abby to obtain her Freedom —

Item the 5th next I desire that after my departure from
 this life, that a Negro man named Peter (now in the
 Possession of Littleberry Priddy) should be equally divided
 (or his Value) between my three Daughters ^{above named} Viz^t Alice
 Jarvis, Nancy Priddy and Susanna Hughes —

Item the 6th next I give to my Son John T Hughes all the
 Land I possess on the South side of Cummings
 Creek, being a part of the Tract I now live on to him
 and his Heirs forever —

all the Land on the North side Cummings Creek
 I leave to my Son John T Hughes and his Heirs forever
