Payne my Executors to this my last Will and Testament.

Further Debt on Judgment of my Son John and one hundred half
 at my death is given to my Son John and one hundred half when he shall
 demand the same. Also after the Death of my Wife. I give to my
 Sons Tandy and Obadiah all my lands wherion I now live and
 also twenty five pounds due to me at the death of my Father
 William and my Mother Hanna Moore of Amhurst County
 in the hands of Brother Benjamin Moore of Amhurst. Also four
 pounds ten Shillings due to me by note the tenth Day of Sept
 in the hands of William Bassett of Fluvanna. Also a good libe-
 ly case and ten Shilling due to me by note the last day of Oct-
 next in the hands of John Foster of Fluvanna. All which monies
 and lands and all other of my goods and Chattles after the decease
 of my now wife I desire to be equally divided between them two
 Brothers by consent. and if not divide the above lands and monies
 and all other of my goods and Chattles as above mentioned one
 half of the value to my Son Tandy Moore and the other half the
 value to my Son Obadiah Moore whom I appoint with his Brother
 Tandy Moore Executors of this my last Will and Testament and
 revoke all other Wills, confirming this and no other to be my
