furniture and the following Slaves viz Thomas Indale
and Mass and after her death it should she marry
(or die) I give the same unto my children and Grand children

 further gave to her a negro woman by name Pat. also one, by
 name Mollie and a negro boy by name Sam also one hund-
 red pounds cash to her and her heirs forever. 6th I give unto
 my daughter Rebecca Anderson one Negro girl by name Moring
 to her and her heirs forever. 7th I give unto my daughter Appa-
 Lona Harrison one negro girl by name Betty the same being
 in her possession I further give her a negro Boy by name George
 to her and her heirs forever. 8th I give unto my daughter Shelton
 Burgess a negro girl by name Baggie also give her a negro boy
 by name James to her and her heirs forever. 9th I give unto my
 daughter Michala Glyburn the sum of five shillings to her and
 her heirs forever. 10th I give unto the Children of Michala Glyburn
 a negro woman by name Phely to be equally divided between
 them and their heirs forever. 11th I give unto my daughter Matta
 Blackburn the sum of five shillings to her and her heirs forever.
 12th I give unto the Children of Matta Blackburn a negro girl by
 name Renee them and their heirs forever also a negro girl by name
 Chechona to them and their heirs forever. 13th I give unto my daugh-
 ter Sabrina Pettis a negro boy by name Daniel also a negro boy
 by name Moses cook to her and her heirs forever. 14th I give unto
 my daughter Thura a negro boy by name John also one hundred and
 fifty dollars cash likewise a house South Westside to her and her heirs
 forever. 15th after the death; or provided my wife Anna Pettis shall
 again marry after my death I desire that my executors hereafter
 named sell the tract of land whereon my house now stands the
 money arising from said sale to be equally divided among my said

children. I shall marry again after my death dispose of
 said land conditionally (given to her) and divide the money arising
 from said sale between all my aforesaid children and Grand Child-
 ren except Rebecca Anderson and her heirs which I wish to have
 no part nor lot in such proceeds that is the children of Mich-
 ala Glyburn and Matta Blackburn to have one ninth part each per-
 cel. and the balance to be equally divided among my said children.
 And I further desire that my executors hereafter named deliver to
 their hands what part of my estate that should fall to the share
 of Matta Blackburn for their benefit and dispose of it for
 their best interest and profit to them as they may find they
 need it or otherwise otherwise to invest it as they think fit
 of William Blackburn as I do not wish any further part of my estate
 to fall into his hands. 17th And lastly I certify and approve my
 friends William Moon Adam Harrison & Thomas Cardwell and
 John D. Moon Executors of this my last and true testament in my
 revoking all former wills by me herebefore made. In witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the 21st
 day of February eight hundred and twenty one

And I further desire that my executors be and remain duly
 apprised that I have entered into a contract commencing from 1821
 with Adam S. Harrison and will not be ended under ten years
 from that date and should I not live until the expiration of that
 time it is my wish the contract on my part to be fully complied

In the name of God, Amen: I William Payne of Fluvanna County being in perfect health and of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit: First of all my will and desire is, that my just Debts be first paid by my executors hereafter to be named by first applying all my ready money I may die possessor of and by selling all my crop of every kind also all my Stock of Horses, Cattle, Hogs, and sheep, and out stand my debts, also all my household furniture, & plantation utensils & the overplus, my will and desire is shall be applied as follows to wit, First I give one hundred pounds to my daughter Nancy Richardson to be paid by my Executors eighteen months after my decease also my negro woman Sarah and her increase.

Item I give unto my son James forty pounds to be paid by my executors eighteen months after my decease.

Item I give unto my daughter Susanna black my negro man Lewis. Item I give unto my daughter Sally Smith, Teller and her increase also my negro boy Mass. Item I give unto my daughter Betty Richardson my negro girl Briten and my negro man young Tom. Item I give unto my son Bennett Payne my negro man Abram and my boy Daniel. Item I give unto my son William Payne my negro man Archer and girl Din-the, also old Tom and Hannah his wife. Item I do hereby appoint my son James Payne my son Bennett Payne, my son William Payne Executors of this my last will and testament.

At a Court of monthly Sessions held for Fluvanna County on Monday the 23rd day of July 1822 I the undersigned William Payne one of the executors in this Will named do make oath before the Lawdords and entered into and taken, and pays a bond in the penalty of Seven thousand dollars with Samuel Ferguson and William Flanagan his securities conditioned as the said bond is aforesaid is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form.
