Division of my Estate and be charged as so much Rec'd.

I do appoint Warren Moore with my beloved wife Rebekah Seay  
Executrix to this my last Will and Testament; Rescinding all other

Mom. I give unto my daughter Mary A Stow five shillings Bury to her and to her daughter Abigail Stow twenty pounds to be raised of the rent of my lands after the decease of my living wife.
