in manner and form following, Revoking all other Wills by me heretofore
made and first, recommending my soul to God who gave it
secondly my Will and desire is that my last debt and burial
charges be paid.

I Give I do give and bequeath unto my living wife Rebecca Say my
land and plantation whereon I now live, during her Widowhood
and after her death or Widowhood, I then give this land and plantation
on to my son Elisha: and his heirs forever lawfully gotten by his body
and if my said son Elisha should die without heirs lawfully begotten
by his body: my will is that this said Land shall be sold, and equally
divided among my other children.

I Give I also do give and bequeath unto my said wife for my two negro
Women, named Fete and Man, them and their increase &c my Stock
of hogs, cattle, hogs and sheep withal household furniture and
plantation tools, and all movables now in my possession during
her Widowhood or Natural life, and after her death or Widowhood
my will and desire is that the negroes and their increase and the
rest of my Estate shall be sold and equally divided amongst my

Children except Eliza & her is to only to have the said as in man-
ner Wills to him. and those of my children that has received things
that I have given to them shall be brought in at the day of
Division of my Estate and be charged as so much Received.

I do appoint Warren Moore with my beloved Wife Abigail Seay
Executors to this my last Will and Testament, Revoking all other
Wills heretofore by me made. In testimony whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this twelfth day of July one
thousand seven hundred and thirty seven.

County during his Natural life, and if during without his begetting
of his Body, lawfully, then said Land to be the right and property of my
Daughter Linnia Knight, during her Natural life, and if this
Linnia Knight dies without her begetting of her Body lawfully, then the said
fifty acres of Land to be sold at public Auction, and the money equalled and
