

Divided among my Sons, provided neither of them leave the Negroes given them, in that case whichever son or Sons shall loose the Negro given him or them, shall make choice of one of the Negroes I have left my Wife at her death, and the overplus equally divided among my Children, my Will and desire is that none of my Sons shall profite their Estate before they arrive at the age of twenty one Years - But shall be under the Government of their Guardians. If either of my Sons should die without an Heir it is my desire that their Estate shall be equally divided among their surviving Brothers.

Last I do hereby constable and my friend John Scottt.  
and my Son Field Allen Duncan Executors to this my

last Will and Testament, and my last Will and Testament  
I give and appoint John Scottt. Guardian to my Children in their  
minority. In witness whereof I have hereunto put my  
hand and seal this twenty first day of July one thousand  
seven hundred and eighty three Years.

No a Court held for Hanover County the sixth day of November 1808. This Writing was this day presented in Court and proved to be the last Will and Testament of George Duncan deceased by the oaths of Martin Davenport and Thomas Dawson two of the witnesses thereto, and admitted to record. And on the motion of John Scottt one of the executors herein named who made oaths thereto, and entered into Bond with William Oglesby Gent his Security in the Penalty of four thousand pounds, conditioned as the Law directs, Certificate is granted him for obtaining a Probate Writ, &c. <sup>test</sup> John Simbalake C.C.

Mem<sup>o</sup>. Should I not return to Port Dick in consequence of death (as all people are liable to accidents) I request Capt<sup>r</sup> Paylor to draw from N<sup>o</sup> Cannon Certificate to the amount of one hundred and fifty four pounds & two pence for Interest for thirteen pounds 19 Shillings. My Slave Thomas may he will send to Miss Samy Callaway in Hanover. Whether on his return he will have delivered to Gen<sup>r</sup> Scottt or pay him nine pounds for him which I owe the Gen<sup>r</sup> - One certificate for one hundred pounds he will find in my Retail Book. My Compensation for five years as Surgeon he will draw and give one half to Miss Ann Lewis the other to himself. My Wages from 1<sup>st</sup> March 1782 to 1<sup>st</sup> January 1783 he will take to himself.
