In the Name of God Amen. I Reuben Hughes being sick & weak but  
of sound sense & memory do constitute this my last Will & Testament in  
manner & form following. Now I desire that my Body may be Decently  
Buried by my executors & us to my worldly & religious Duties of my  
Honor. I send unto my beloved wife Mary my whole property real &  
personal during her life & at her Death I will and desire it may be dis-  
posed of as follows. Now I give unto my son Reuben all the Land on the  
side of the Road whereon he now resides, with an addition of the Land  
on this side of the Road from the lower line up to the old field running  
as the path to the bridge now does, to James Quarles line, in considera-  
tion of which he my son Reuben to be at one half of the expense of  
supporting my Daughter Rachael after her mothers Death as  
long as she lives. Now I give unto my son Joseph the same piece of  
Land on this side the Road whereon I now reside, with the said  
Land I give unto my said son Reuben to be at one half of the expense of  
supporting my Daughter Rachael after her mothers Death as long as she  
lives, in consideration of which he my son Reuben to be at one half of  
the expense of supporting my said Daughter Rachael during her life

executors of this my last Will and Testament  
in presence of three witnesses at my house and seal this 16 day of  
June 1813
