I Joseph Fitzpatrick of Fluvanna County being sick of Body but in perfect mind and memory, calling to mind that it is now appointed for all men to dye, do make this my last Will and Testament in manner following: first if it should please the Lord to take me from hence, I recommend my Body to the Earth from whence it came, and my Soul to God I commend it and all my Trusting such worldly goods as it hath pleased Almighty God to bless me with. I give in

Manner as follows, *Item* to my son Benjamin, I give one Negro Boy named Nicholas to him & his heirs forever. *Item* to my son William, I give one Negro Boy named John, to him & his heirs forever. *Item* to my son Joseph, I give one Negro Boy named Toby, to him & his heirs forever. *Item* I give to my sons William and Joseph one thousand Acres of Land lying at Martins Kings Fork Roads, to be equally divided between my two said Sons, and to their heirs forever. *Item*, to my Daughter ^{Elizabeth} Hurd, I give ten pounds current Money. *Item* I lend to my Daughter Molly Wright the land, whereon she now lives, and one Negro Girl, Tillie during her life and then the said land, and one Negro and her heirs forever, to be equally divided amongst my said Daughters children to them and their heirs forever. *Item* to my grand son William Hurd, Son of Geo. Hurd, should it please God he should live to the age of eighteen years I then give to him and his heirs forever, one Negro Girl, named Agnes, and should he die before arriving to that age, my will and desire is that the said Negro Girl Agnes, should then belong to Joseph Hurd, Son of Thomas Hurd, to him & his heirs forever. *Item*, to my sons Benth and Rene, I give them the land, with one plantation whereon I live, it containing three hundred Acres to them & their heirs forever.

Also I give to my said Sons Benth and Rene, the two bottles they have in possession, also I give to my said Sons, one

Antrey of land I have on the middle creek. Also another entry I have on the north River, to them and their heirs forever. *Item*, I give to my two Sons Benth and Rene, Negroes Toby and his child Toby, Gincy a Negro Wench, the said Negroes to be equally divided between my two Sons Benth and Rene after my wife's decease, and then to them and their heirs forever. *Item* I lend to my loving wife Molly Tilypatrick a Negro Wench named Sarey during her life and after my wife's decease, I give the said Negro Wench Sarah to my son William and his heirs forever. *Item* I give to my sons William and Joseph a Cow and calf each, and all the rest of my stock and household furniture to remaine with my wife during her life, and then to be equally divided between my two Sons Benth and Rene. *Item* I give to my wife my riding horse, and my old mare to my son William. The ready money I now am in possession of, to be put to the use of paying my just Debts. Also my old house land, it contains two hundred and sixty five Acres to be sold and the money arising from the said sale to be put to the use of paying my Debts. And my Negroes to remaine in possession of my wife during her life their names Toby, Mall, Tilly, Gincey, Sarah. my desire is that my son Benth should have twelve months schooling. I appoint my Sons William Tilypatrick, Joseph Tilypatrick and Benth Tilypatrick Executors of this my last will and Testa-

ment even my loving wife is hereby signified in and the same in Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my
