ner and form following, first I desire that attorney fees & costs and  
funeral expences be paid. Impoimis I leave unto my Son Lath-  
er Stone during his natural life two Negroes to wit a Woman named  
ca Dilsey and her Son Simon and their increase and after his  
decease I give the said Negroes to his Children and their Heirs to  
be equally divided between them, and for want of such Child or  
children I give the said Negroes to his Brothers and Sisters to  
be equally divided between them. Impoimis I give unto Son  
Elijah Stone and his Heirs forever a Negro fellow named Bob.  
Impoimis I give to William Woolins Son of Joseph Woolins  
begot on a Daughter Elizabeth now deceased and his Heirs  
a Negro Woman named Hannah and a Negro Boy named
