I William Stone of the County of Albemarle being of sound mind and memory, to make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, first I desire that all my just Debts and funeral expences be paid. Impresment I lend unto my Son also Stone during his natural life two Negroes to wit, a Woman named Diley and her Son Siman and their increase and after his decease I give the said Negroes to his Children and their Heirs to be equally divided between them, and for want of such Child or children I give the said Negroes to his Brothers and Sisters to be equally divided between them. Impresment I give unto Son Elijah Stone and his heirs forever a Negro fellow named Bob. Impresment I give to William Woolins Son of Joseph Woolins begot on my Daughter Elizabeth now deceased and his Heirs a Negro Woman named Hannah and a Negro Boy named
