to me for the purchase of a negro man named Sam

I now give unto my sister Christiana Powell all my bed clothes and wearing apparel which she has in her possession to her & her heirs forever.

I now give and bequeath unto my sister Barbara Blincoe one feather bed & furniture and all my bed covers together with my chest and all my wearing apparel which is now in my possession being with Mark Blincoe her husband to her and her heirs forever.

From all the rest and residue of my estate both real and personal including all debts due me & money on hand I give and bequeath unto Thomas Blincoe son of d^d Mark Blincoe to him and his heirs forever. Lastly I do constitute and appoint Walter Timberlake Executor to this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Will or Wills by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed the seal of the County of Henrico on the 25th day of February 1870.
