above boy Archon should be sold to the highest bidder within months next and the money arising therefrom to be divided in manner and form following - I give and bequeath to my son Roland Jones one hundred dollars to him and his heirs forever I give and bequeath to my son David Jones one hundred dollars to him and his heirs forever - The balance of the money I give to my wife Sally Jones to do with as she may think proper - Signed and acknowledged the said David Jones on the eighth day of January one thousand eight hundred and seventeen

This I shall together with the said order of the Court and this day in open Court proved by the oath of the said James and Daniel M. Bengep Witnesses and the said John Goodman. And on the motion of Roland Jones and James Jones executors named who made oath thereas as the Law directs and solemnly and acknowledged bind in the penalty of Ten thousand dollars with John Jones and John M. Haden their securities condone as the Law directs certificate is granted them for obtaining a probate thereof in due form
