1780. This Inventory and appraisement of the Estate of George Thompson deceased, was this day returned and admitted to record

The 17 day of February in the Year of our Lord 1780. I Mary Pasley of Shuanna County being sick and weak in Body but of perfect mind and memory and calling to mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, as Touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life. I give devise and dispose of the same in manner and form following that to wit In the first place it is my devise that all my just Debts should be paid and then I give to my eldest Son Solomon Pasley one Dish and four plates, and to my Daughter Mary Gallowsy one Dish and four plates and two Bushels and a half of Corn. I give to my youngest Son Robert Pasley to him and his Heirs for ever one Feather Bed and furniture, one ^{large} Dish and potrack two Bushels and a half of Corn, one Trench two Leather plates and one Bottle. I also lend to my Daughter Sally Haggard during her natural life one Feather Bed and furniture

One Basin four Quater Spoons and two Bushels and half of Corn to be given to her Children to them and their Heirs forever at her decease And then the remainder of my worldly goods I desire may be sold and the money divided in the following manner To my eldest Son Solomon Pasley I give one third part of the sum of the said Money to him and his Heirs forever To my Daughter Susan Pasley I lend another third part of the money and desire that it may be paid to her Daughter Molly Gynson when she comes of age or married - And the other third of the said Money I lend to my Daughter Molly Gallowsy and desire it may be paid to her Daughter Mary Watson Gallowsy when she comes of age or married and I do hereby utterly disavow revoke and disannul all other Wills and Testaments by me made

I give to Elizabeth Good, an orphan Girl, which I have had
from her Infancy, to her and her Heirs forever, I give to Ann
Thompson, a free Mulatta Woman, the aforesaid Cow and half
and feather Bed, and the above mentioned two hundred pounds,
to her and her Heirs forever. My Will and desire is, that the
free use of all Fla. Hemp & Cotton, made on my plantation,
also the grain now provided for the ensuing years provision,
be allowed my family for their support and maintenance
untill the aforesaid time of November next, and the sur-
plus of either of these articles to be sold as aforesaid. I desire
that my Executors hereafter named see, that Thomas Mot-
ter an orphan Lad living at my House be bound out to
some good honest trade. I do hereby appoint William
Oglety and Sunday Bay Executors of this my last Will

In Obedience to an order of the Worshipful Court of
Fluvanna County in the Subscribers met and proceeded to
settle the Administration of Ann Venable, but no Account of
George mor Georges was kept by Theresa Administration till her
intermarriage with Nathaniel Mays in 1776. Theresa
Administration alledging that the profits of the Estate was
expended in supporting the expenses of one deceased and pay-
ing his Debts and produced an Account of one hundred
