1780. This Inventory and appraisement of the Estate of George
Thompson deceased, was this day returned and admitted to record.

In the Name of God. Amen.

The 17 day of February in the Year of our Lord 1780. I
Mary Pasley of Henric County being sick and weak
in Body but of perfect mind and memory and calling to mind
the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for
all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and
Testament, as Touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has
pleased God to bless me in this life. I give devise and dispose of the
same in manner and form following that to wit In the first
place it is my devise that all my just Debts should be paid and
then I give to my eldest Son Solomon Pasley one Dish and four
plates, and to my Daughter Mary Galtsope one Dish and four
plates and two Bushells and a half of Corn. I give to my young-
est Son Robert Pasley to him and his Heirs forever one Feather
Bed and furniture, ^{bed} one large Dish and potrack
two Bushells and a half of Corn, one Trench two Earthen plates
and one Bottle. I also lend to my Daughter Sally Haggard
during her natural life one Feather Bed and furniture

Chest and Table two Wheels one pair Cotton Cards one
great Pot and half one new 168 Shag my horses and flocks

One Basin four painted Spoons and two Bushells and half of Corn
lent to her children to them and their Heirs forever at her decease
And then the remainder of my worldly goods I desire may be sold
and the money divided in the following manner To my eldest
Son Solomon Pasley I give one third part of the sum of the said
Money to him and his Heirs forever To my Daughter Susan
Pasley I lend another third part of the money and desire that it
may be paid to her Daughter Molly Gimson when she comes of
age or married. And the other third of the said Money I lend
to my Daughter Molly Galtsope and desire it may be paid
to her Daughter Mary Watson Galtsope when she comes of
age or married and I do hereby utterly disavow revoke and
disannul all other Wills and Testaments by me made or made
in writing and hereby confirm and confirm my last
Will and Testament. In Witness whereof have hereunto

I John Good of Fluvanna County being of sound mind and me-
mory do constitute this to be my last Will and Testament in
the manner and form following. My desire is that all my
Estate both real and personal (except a bed and bedfurniture
a feather Bed) be disposed of, some time in November next
at public Auction, allowing three Months credit, and
the money arising therefrom excepting two hundred pounds
I give to Elizabeth Good, an orphan girl, which I have known
from her Infancy, to her and her heirs forever, I give to Ann
Thompson, a free Mulatto Woman, the aforesaid Cow and calf
and feather Bed, and the above mentioned two hundred pounds
to her and her heirs forever. My Will and desire is, that the
free use of all Flax Hemp &c Cotton, made on my plantation
also the grain now provided for the ensuing years provision,
be allowed my family for their support and maintenance
untill the aforesaid time of November next, and the over-
plus of either of these articles to be sold as aforesaid. I desire
that my Executors hereafter named see, that Thomas Ma-
son an orphan lad living at my House be bound out to
some good honest trade. I do hereby appoint William
Ogleby and Sunday Bay Executors of this my last Will

and Testament, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and Seal this seventeenth day of January 1781.

It is my Will and desire that the above mentioned orphan lad
be schooled at the discretion of my Executors.
