In further assistance to the within order we the undersigned have voted and resolved to Matthew H Rice and Joanna his wife their part of the present Estate of Turner Mose Dec^r 10th 1803 to wit one Negro man named Edward one Negro girl named Hank also one feather bed and framework all other part from the amount of tales which sum is Ninety five dollars and twenty two Cents also have voted and resolved to Sarah Mose and William Mose Guardians for Turner Mose Orphans doth one Negro woman named Anna and Negro girl name Rachel one boy named Smith and one girl named Petrahah also two feather beds and furniture with there part of the amount of tales which sum is one hundred Eighty five dollars and forty four cent

Matthew H Rice late widow and widow of Turner Mose deceased in the State of his late husband Turner Mose never being returned and dead and the said report being objected to on behalf of the children of the late Turner Mose passed by this Committee on consideration of said report the Court of Admiralty and it is accordingly ordered that the Commissioners appointed by a former Court may three of these pages upon the back of this instrument be a precedent and view the same and consider and vote what will be done and that they make an appropriate Order for him to visit him proper and make further what they will

Jan^r 4th 1809 In pursuance to the order of the Committee Court of Admiralty Book X, 1808-1823 recorded in the admiralitie book has been made in due according to law and wherein the former settlement of a sum made by us to Joanna Rice widow of Turner Mose and after making all necessary alterations to the language of the same we feel ourselves constrained to confirm the same. In the sum made by us in making the same we do state out to Joanna Rice a sum from the fearlessness of human justice we may have paid but we do say below that after awaiting settlement of all the sums of money which is in our power that in this report we have rendered justice to the sum left us in hands the date above written.
