same in the following manner and form. First I give and bequeath
to William Lane and Emily Rice my beloved Son and Daughter
and Negro Woman named Nancy to be divided between them two
also I give unto my ^{well} beloved Daughter Franky Lane and her
Negro girl named Ann (raising her life if she has a daughter then at
her death to go to and if not it is to return to William Lane and
Emily Rice also I give all that which is my share to William Lane
and Emily Rice and Franky Lane except my clothes they
are to be equally divided between all my daughters and daughters in
law. William Lane and Emily Rice whom I likewise constitute

 day of February 1810 the Court was informed that the
 funds by the sale of the late Benjamin and John Benjamin
 of the Wilkes County are intended to be recorded in the name
 of Richard Pender one of the Quakers Church arrived who made
 such friends as the two schools and others in the neighborhood and
 the Court of two hundred dollars with Miriam Norriss, Postell
 and Quarell Black his trustees continued at the Court
 and the Court granted him for allowing a further charge from
