Which I have now in my possession and do hereby give and bequeath to my only Executor, a white housewife to Sarah's wife, I give also a velvet cloak to my dear son. I give a bed quilt and quilted by Betty Johnson a Bed Metal Skillet and fettle to Mary Dammal a bed to George son, a small trunk to James son, one half dozen of plates and spoons to Abraham son, a small decanter to Betty's wife; And all my clothing I desire to be divided amongst the Daughters of George son, a sheet and Bed I give unto George son, I also give unto Rebecca's wife a pair of sheets and one Blankett & Bed quilt. I hereby make void and Null all other Wills by me made and declare and Publish this as my last Will and Testament in the manner and form as is Written.
