I find a balance in favor of said decedent's estate of thirteen hundred and sixty five dollars, and ninety two cents, as is exhibited in said Acct. but your Commissioners beg leave to observe that a Bond of \$100 taken by Jos Haden in his lifetime on a James Duvall of Augusta County is thought to be doubtful perhaps desperate. There is also a debt of \$80 due from William Wood where of \$30 dollars is enjoined which debt was also contracted by Jos Haden in lifetime. There is also a Bond in suit in the County Court of Albemarle for \$147.98 which Bond was taken by the Executor John W. Haden for property sold at the sale and appears to us to be enjoined for the full Am^t by the bill being exhibited was all which is submitted to the Court.
