of Gloucester do make and ordain this my last will and testa-
ment hereby revoking and making void all and every other
will or wills by me heretofore made.

First It is my earnest desire that all my just debts be paid
speedily. The whole of my estate both real and personal after
payment of my debts I lend unto my beloved wife, Maria during
her natural life or widowhood.

Secondly After the death or intermarriage of my said wife, Maria
I give bequeath and dispose of my said estate in manner
following to wit

To my Son James I give my writing Desk to him and his
heirs forever.

To my Son David I give a tract of Land adjoining that on which
he now lives - it being the balance remaining of a tract called
Bayards after taking off one hundred acres which I conveyed to
his Brother John whose balance is supposed to be left than
one hundred acres to him and his heirs forever.

To my Sons Nathan and James I give the tract of Land on which
I now reside and which I purchased of William & Bernard
Heslop supposed to contain about three hundred acres to be the
same share as I had in the same land.

To my daughter Mary (wife of Nicholas Briggs) I give a Negro
woman now in her possession and her future increase
to her and her heirs forever.

To my daughter Anna I give a Negro Girl named Betty and
her future increase to her and her heirs forever.

To my daughters Nancy Boley and Anne and to my son James
I give each a house of sixty dollars value to them and their heirs
forever to be raised and furnished out of my estate, even in case
of division unless I should in my life time give them a better
of them such house which if done such value as is in lieu of
this bequest as respects such as may come out of my estate.

To my daughter Maria and to my son James I give
each a feather bed and furniture to them and their heirs forever
and I bequeath out of my estate such a parcel of land as
unless I should in my life time give them a better of them as to
and furniture which if done is to be raised out of my estate
as respects such as may be furnished with such bed and furniture.

To my sister Betty Keefe I give a house of about fifty dollars value
to her and her heirs forever to be raised out of my estate and furnished
her when ever she may require the same after my death.

It is my will and desire that if either of the Negro Girls named
-ed herein to my daughters Nancy and Anne should die before they
get actual and lawful possession thereof either Negro or Negroes of
the full value of such that may die shall be furnished out of
my estate or money to the value thereof to be raised to reimburse the
one or both of my said Daughters on account of the loss of such
before a general division of my estate which Negroes or
Negroes I do in case of such event give to

Whereas I have made my last will and Testament, as the same is contained in the said will and Testament, I will now begin with to bequeath and give unto my children to be possessed and enjoyed by them and their heirs forever except as herein after recited to wit: Having first paid and satisfying advances of money to, and paid some debt for, my son John the whole of which I estimate to at least one hundred dollars. It is my will and desire that the said amount of one hundred dollars (without interest) be deducted from the part of my said estate which should be entitled to in case of an equal division, to go to the use of my other children - also having first given and conveyed to my son in law John Johnson and Nancy his wife a small tract of Land which they now live on which I estimate to be worth twenty five pounds my will and desire is that the said amount of five pounds (without interest) be also deducted from the part of my said estate which my said Daughter Nancy would be entitled to in case of an equal division to go to the use of my other children.

Lastly I bequeath and appoint my sons John, David, Nathan and James and my friend John Simbolake joint executors of this my last will and Testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this nineteenth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three.
