In the name of God Amen. I Royal Woodson of Fluvanna
 County being in health and sound memory do make and declare
 this my last will and Testament in manner and form as following-
 I give to my daughter Sarah C. both the Negroes now
 her possession and at her decease they and their issue to be equally
 divided amongst her children then living to have & to have forever.

I then I give to my son in Law William F. Mann and his wife Eliza-
 beth both the Negroes in their possession and their heirs forever.
 But in case the said Elizabeth F. Mann or Sarah C. shall hereafter
 lay any claim to any part of the rest of my estate that which I have given
 them in this will they shall pay to my last children then living (viz)
 Nancy, Franky, Martha Paul, Billy, Jane, Rachel, Rebecca and Mildred
 Jordan two hundred pounds each.

I then I send to my loving wife Martha Woodson her negroes viz panny
 & Bill one Felix and a furniture her two children viz William and the
 land & plantation I have been in during her life and after her death to be
 equally divided amongst my other children viz Nancy, Franky, Martha Paul,
 Billy, Jane, Rachel, Rebecca, Mildred Jordan.
 I give to each of my children then living and their heirs forever
 I have been & am now

Rebecca and Mildred Jordan the balance of my estate
 I give to my sons viz Peter, Lucy, Charles, Billy, Betty, Fanny
 with all my stock of hogs sheep, cattle and horses all
 my land and plantation I have been in during my life and after my death
 to be equally divided amongst my children then living and their heirs forever
 I have seven daughters to them and their heirs forever
 I have no will and desire is that my Negroes shall not be sold but
 as above mentioned. I do appoint my son in Law
 William F. Mann Executor with my loving wife Martha Woodson
 as co-executors of this my last will and Testament, touching all other will
 & wills by me made. In Witness whereof I have set my
 hand the day of July one thousand eight hundred and fourteen
 years and Achenabago

 attested. And on the motion of Henry F. Mann the undersigned names
 who made oath there as the Law directs and entered into and acknowledged
 Bond in the penalty of fifteen thousand dollars with Samuel T. Woodson
 his surety conditioned as the Law directs certificate is granted him for
