### Fluvanna Co. VA Will Bk 1, 17-1808

At a court held for Fluvanna County on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of June 1801

This inventory and appurtenant of the estate of Patrick Apries deceased was this day returned and ordered to be recorded

In the name of God amen I Richard Blitham of the County of Fluvanna being in perfect mind and memory do make & ordain this my last will and Testament in manner & form following To wit.

I send unto my son James Blitham one acre to be chosen by him off out of my stock of negroes after the death of my beloved wife Grace Blitham. I also let him the land in bounds wherein I now live except what shall be disposed of hereafter during his life and his infirmities. I also give unto my fellow cabin and board boy no wife he shall be pleased to have and hold to me until his death.

Item I give unto my daughter Margaret. Daughter of Blitham. Null tenure for lands to be equally among her Negro woman named Sarah and the tract of land wherein she and the said Null is now living for the benefit & use of her during her life which said property shall remain under the control and disposal of my executors and at her death the said woman and land household and kitchen furniture plantation utensils and stock of every kind that I have remaining on the said land shall be sold and the money arising out from the sale thereof to be divided equally between her children.

Item I send unto my daughter Apries. Null wife of John Null one Negro during their lives which said Negro she may make choice of out of my stock of negroes after the death of my wife (my son James Blitham having first choice) and after their death to be divided equally between her children.

Item I give unto my daughter Polly Brooks wife of William Brooks on the long & true price I also do hereby reserve one Negro boy by the name of Phillips for his benefit and use during her life which said negro shall remain under the control of my executors and after his death to be divided equally between her children.

Item I send unto my daughter Tabitha. Null wife of Bob. Null one Negro sold by the name of Phillis during his life and after his death to be divided equally between her children.

Item I give unto my grandson Thomas Blitham son of Ben. Blitham deceased after the death of my wife a negro boy named Jack son of Sarah and a tract of land to be laid off out of the tract wherein I now live. Being at a corner near Apries old property and running from thence on east corner to where my late Cousin the East pack of Cunningham is to a certain about 10 acres. Provided that he the said Thomas will settle and reside on it for life but if he refuses to reside on it for life it shall go to my son James Blitham during his life and his wife's widowhood and after their death to be divided equally between his children and should the said Thomas die before his wife then the same shall go to his wife P.M. Blitham.
