 named Doll and her Boy named Boy and Sarah I give and bequeath
 unto my three children to wit, Sophia P. Mason, William Sugg Mason
 and Joseph Lee Mason between them to be equally divided to them
 and their heirs forever. And in case of the death of either one or more
 of my said children without a lawful issue my will and power is that
 the survivors or survivors shall possess and enjoy the part hereby bequeathed
 to the child or children so dying. I appoint my friends John M.
 Mason, Reuben Saunders and John Timberlake Jr. Executors of the my
 last Will and Testament hereby making and making void all other Will
 or Wills by me herebefore made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto
 signed my hand and caused my seal to be hereunto affixed this
 seventeenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and seven
