The last Will & Testament of Richard Mayo
In the name of God Amen I Richard (Alias) Richard Mayo
of Gloucester County being at this time weak of
my body and memory and under the care of my law
and advice do make and declare this 21st day of June

my writing office at the time
I make my last will & Testament
by me made First I desire that all my just debts be paid.
2ndly I give away and bequeath unto my friend William S Lane
and to his heirs executors administrators and assigns from all my estate
whatsoever both real & personal remaining after payment of my debts
as aforesaid in which property I mean to include a woman of color
named Suckey called my wife and her future increase if any.

My Will is that this property shall all be held by & under the
entire control of my friend said William S Lane and managed and
disposed of as we may think proper with and under this special
trust and confidence that he will at his discretion permit the said
woman Suckey & her future increase and also my brother a freeman
of color named Ned (generally called Sam) to enjoy the benefit
of the profits of said property during their lives and after their death
survivor in such manner and form as he my said friend William
S Lane shall think best so as to promote their ease and comfort
during their lives as aforesaid. It is also my Will and desire that
my said friend William S Lane shall at his discretion sell or dispose of
any part of my said property to answer the purpose aforesaid.

After the decease of said woman Suckey & her increase if any and
my said brother Ned. It is my will and desire that my said friend
William S Lane shall have no less now property the balance which
may remain of the estate hereby devised and bequeathed to friends
Neddy I appoint the sum of £1000 before the decease of
the my last will & Testament

to be left with & retained by the
said woman Suckey who substituted our names
in witness in his presence and at his request
