In the name of God, Amen. I John Say of the County of
Fluvanna, being in a low state of health in body, but in my perfect
senses and memory, thank be to Almighty God for the same, ever
calling to mind the Mortality of man, that it is appointed for all
men once to die: do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament
in manner and form following, Revoking all other Wills by me heretofore
made and first recommending my soul to God to give it
Secondly my Will and desire is that my last Will and Testament
charges be paid.

I have I do give and bequeath unto my living wife Rebecca Say my
land and plantation whereon I now live, during her Widowhood
and after her death or Widowhood, I then give the said land and plantation
on to my son Elisha: and his heirs forever lawfully gotten by his body
and if my said son Elisha should die without heirs lawfully gotten
by his body: my will is that the said Land shall be sold, and equally
divided among my other children.

I have I also do give and bequeath unto my said wife my two negroes
Woman named Tobe and Man, them and their increase &c my Stock
of hogs, cattle, hogs and Sheep withal household furniture and
plantation tools, and all moveables now in my possession during
her Widowhood or Natural life, and after her death or Widowhood
my own and none is mine the negroes and their increase and the
rest of my Estate shall be sold and equally divided amongst my
