ordain this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form
as follows (to wit) Item I give and bequeath unto my son
Theodore Layne one hundred and ten acres of Land lying in
Goodland county, adjoining John Martin being the Land whereon
he now lives — Item I give unto my son Jacob Beardsall
Layne one hundred acres of Land lying over the creek adjoining
Shadrach Walker being the Land whereon he now
lives — Item I give and bequeath unto my son Elisha Layne
one hundred and fifty acres of Land being the place
whereon I now live, also one gun and one fowling piece

the remaining part of my Estate not already devised

unto my son Elisha, and the other half I leave unto my wife
during her life and at her death I give and bequeath the same
unto my said son Elisha Layne — Item I give unto my other
children (to wit) Samuel Layne, John Layne, Jacob Layne,
Lucy Martin, Judith Howard, and Molly Bazley one
shilling each — Lastly I constitute, nominate and ordain
my son Elisha Layne my Executor to this my last Will
and Testament & also desire there shall be no appraisement
of my Estate, Witness my hand and seal this 15th day
of November 1798

thousand Dollars with Reuben Martin his Security conditioned
