First and principally I recommend my Soul into the hands of

my Body to be Buried in a decent manner at the direction
of my Executors hereafter mentioned and for my Estate I give
and dispose thereof in manner and form following. Item I
hereby empower my Executors to sell as much of my Estate as

well pay all my just Debts. Injuries I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Baber during her

life without any interruption, the Plantation and land where
and I now live, a part of an entry of Land Surveyed by Thos
Baber Sen^r being the part that joins one Beginning at

Thomas Baber Sen^r and William Davis corner line run-

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Standley Baber all the rest of my Estate both real and personal except the remainder part of that Survey above mentioned; only that it is will and desire that my son Standley Baber shall be maintained out of my Estate so long as he may shall continue to live likewise the charges in raising of thirty to be paid also out of my Estate. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Standley Baber if he should be living at my wife's death the land and plantation wherein I now live to him and his Heirs forever, but if he should die before his Mother and leave no Heir lawfully begotten, I then leave it to be sole with all the rest of my Estate that shall remain at my wife's death and the amount of said Soil to be equally divided among

all my Children then living ~~and dying before me~~ ^{and dying before me}

die before their Mother and leave her or Heirs lawfully begotten they shall inherit their part equally. Item I give and bequeath unto my Sons John and Obadiah the remainder of that plantation mentioned to them and their Heirs forever an item paying off ten pounds to my Estate to be divided as follows with John to have that part lying on the hogpen fork Obadiah to have that part that lies on the Great Branch of John should chose to have to keep his fifteen pounds then have the land. I then empower my Executors to sell his part and the amount of said Soil to be equally divided as the rest of my Estate above mentioned. Lastly I make constitute and ordain and appoint my beloved wife John Mastin and William Bushell my Executrix of this my last Will
