I Thomas Baber Son^r of the County of Fluvanna being very Sick and weak in Body but of sound mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. First and principally I recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God Creator ^{my} hoping to receive Salvation through the merits of my blessed Saviour and redeemer Jesus Christ, and my Body to be Buried in a decent manner at the direction of my Executors hereafter mentioned and for my Estate I give and dispose thereof in manner and form following. Now I hereby empower my Executors to sell so much of my Estate as will pay all my just Debts. Inprimis I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Baber during her life without any interruption, the plantation and land where on I now live & a part of an entry of Land Surveyed by Tho^s Baber Jun^r being the part that joins one Beginning at Thomas Baber Jun^r and William Paces corner line run.

SAME more or less, also all the rest of my Estate both real and
 personal except the remainder part of that Survey above men-
 tioned, only that it is well and aware that my son Standley
 Baber shall be maintained out of my Estate so long as he is
 shall continue here likewise the charges in curing of his leg
 to be paid also out of my Estate. Item I give and bequeath un-
 to my son Standley Baber if he should be living at my wife's
 death the land and plantation whereon I now live to him and
 his Heirs forever, but if he should die before his Mother and
 leave no Heir lawfully begotten, I then leave it to be sold with
 all the rest of my Estate that shall remain at my wife's death
 and the amount of said Sale to be equally divided among
 all my Children then living and if any of my Children should
 die before their Mother and leave her or Heir lawfully begotten
 they shall inherit their part equally. Item I give and bequeath
 unto my Sons John and Obadiah the remainder of that plantation
 mentioned to them and their Heirs forever an John paying fif-
 teen pounds to my Estate to be divided as followeth John to have
 that part lying on the happen fork Obadiah to have that part
 that lies on the Great Branch of John should choose whether to
 keep his fifteen pounds then have the land I then empower my
 Executors to sell his part and the amount of said Sale to be equally
 divided as the rest of my Estate above mentioned. Lastly I make
 constitute and ordain and appoint my beloved wife, John
 Maston and William Basket my Executors of this my last will
