At a Court continued and held for Newanna County
 on Tuesday the 3rd day of April 1789.

This Will was then duly proved in Court with the Testimony
 and Testament of James Adams deceased and sundry witnesses

and examined by the hand Writing of the said James Adams it ap-
 pears to this Court that the said Will was really written by the said
 Testator himself and ordered that the same be recorded, and at
 a Court held for this County the first day of October in the year
 aforesaid, On the motion of Thomas Adams and Robert Adams
 two of the Executors named in this Will who made oath to the same
 and Entered into Bond with W^m Adams, Charles Adams, Richard
 Adams Securities in the penalty of fifteen hundred pounds con-
 ditioned as the Law directs. Certificate is granted them for obtaining
 a probate thereof in due form.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Lucy Bailey the Ballance of a Tract of Land sold to Ambrose Negitt to her and heirs forever. Item I have thought proper to give the land Ambrose Negitt has bought of me and paid for that it is my desire he keep the same without interruption.

Item the Remains of my Estate both real and personal including also a feather bed and furniture William Clarke has in possession be sold at public Auction, and the money Equally divided Amongst Agnes Clark Lucy Bailey and her four Children to wit Nathaniel Bailey Charles Bailey David Bailey Holly Bailey to them and their heirs forever I do hereby revoke and disannul all other Wills and Testaments whatsoever and I do hereby constitute and appoint Ralph Banks John Bailey brother and Nathaniel Unable my sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and affixed my seal this Twentyfirst day of November one thousand seven hundred and Eighty Eight.

At a Court held for Henrico County on Thursday the 11th day of June 1789 This Willing was this day produced in Court and proved to be the last Will and Testament of Thomas Bailey by the oath of Isaac Bryant Thomas Bailey Junr and David Shephard the witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded: and Time is allowed the Executors therein named to qualify to their Will. And also Court held for Henrico County the 3^d day of September in the year aforesaid The Executors named in the said Will refusing to take upon themselves the burden of the Execution thereof. On the motion of Charles Bailey and he taking the oath appointed by Law, and entering into Bond with T^h Bailey his security in the penalty of one hundred pounds, conditioned as the Law directs; Certificate is granted from forth the Court sitting at Henrico County to wit the Clerk of the Court to the said Charles and Creditors of the said Thomas Bailey do it with the Will annexed, in due form.
