bequeath to my son William the following Negro Slaves, Cook Man and
Sham to possess and use during his Natural life. And after his death
my Will and desire is that they the said Slaves and all their future
increase be equally divided between his Male Heirs. I
bequeath to my son Joseph the following Negro Slaves, Jacob and Sander to
possess and use during his Natural life. And after his death my Will
and desire is that they the said Slaves and all their future increase be
Equally divided between his Male Heirs. I bequeath to my son
Benjamin the following Negro Slaves, Sam^l to possess and use during his
Natural life. And after his death my Will and desire is that they the
said Slaves and all their future increase be equally divided between his
Male Heirs. I bequeath to grandson Lamer son of Benjamin
the following Negro Slave, Nino to possess and use during his Natural
life and after his death my Will and desire is that if either of my sons
shall die, my Will and desire is that if either of my sons

be grandson son of Benjamin by the name of Benjamin Joseph and
having made them or their heirs lawfully begotten that the Negro Slaves which
I have but them and all their future increase be equally divided between my
two sons as shall then be living. Lastly I constitute and appoint my three
sons William Joseph and Benjamin Bradshaw my lawfull Executors
in this my last Will and Testament by me made. In Witness whereof
the said William Bradshaw hath set his hand and seal this
third day of January Eighteen hundred.
