Item I give and bequeath unto my dear and loving Wife all the remainder part of my Estate both real and personal to dispose of the same as she shall think proper and I do hereby constitute ordain and appoint her to be the whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the twentieth day of August in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty three.
