 sum of thirty pounds to be raised out of my estate at my wife's decease to
 her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto Forest
 Furbush son of Robert Furbush and Mary his wife at the death of my
 wife ten Negroes namely Tom and James to him and his heirs forever.
 Item I give and bequeath unto Pleasant White at the decease of
 my wife and to his heirs forever five Negroes namely Soper Melley
 Melley and Henry with the future increase of the females upon his
 paying unto his sister Melinda White or to her children in case
 she should not then be living one tenth part of the appraised value
 of the five Negroes and their increase at the time she and Pleasant

Personal Test to my wife as above and that I hereby give my power unto my said wife and that there is to be disposed of at her discretion by will or otherwise as she may think proper. Lastly I appointed my said wife Abigail because I my former Benjamin Thayer and Robert Hunt Executors of this ^{my} last will and Testament hereby revoking all former will or wills by me made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and together my seal to be affixed this fourteenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and seven. Signed sealed published and declared by the Testator to his last will in presence of us who witness the same at his request.

At a Court held for Plummer County on Monday the 27th day of July 1867. This writ was this day presented in Court and proved by the oath of John Timberlake, John Holland and Charles Shepherd three of the witnesses thereof and sworn to be correct. Once on the release of Benjamin Brewster one of the Carousins therein named who were each thereof according to Law and entered into Bond with William Backwell his security in the Penalty of Ten thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs. Satisfaction is granted him for obtaining a proper thereof in due form.
