I give and bequeath my Soul to God that gives it hoping for eternal Salvation through the merits of ^{my dear Redeemer} Jesus Christ and for what worldly Goods it hath pleased God to bestow me with I dispose of in the manner and form following to wit after my Just Debt and funeral charges are paid I give and bequeath to my Dear and loving wife Elizabeth Rowe one Mare named Peg and Saddle one head of Cattle one head of Hogs, a feather Bed and Furniture and fifty pounds Current Money of Virginia. Item I give and bequeath to my Son Stephen Rowe one Gray Mare. Item I give and bequeath to my Son William Sargeant Rowe one Bay Mare. Item I give and bequeath to my Son Edward Dillards Rowe one Colt which the boy (Mans) is now Pregnant with. Item I give and bequeath to my Son John Rowe one father Bed and Furniture. Item I give and

to bequeath to my Daughter Susanna Rowe one Bed and Furniture. Also I give and bequeath to my Son Lewis Rowe Ten pounds Current Money of Virginia. Also I give and bequeath to my Son Reuben Rowe ten pounds Current Money of Virginia. Also I give and bequeath to my Son William Rowe Ten pounds Current Money of Virginia. Also I give and bequeath to my Daughter Susanna Leach Rowe ten pounds Current Money of Virginia. The Remainder part of my estate I leave to be equally divided between all my Children. Lastly I nominate and appoint my dear and loving wife Elizabeth Rowe and my Son Stephen Rowe Joint Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
