and being desirous to dispose of what property whatsoever God hath
blessed me with do make and constitute this my last Will and testa-
ment as follows and from following that is to say Item 1st I give
and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary all my lands and possessions
both here and also three Negroes viz Eliza Esther and Ann.

shall remain my wife and my said wife shall have the use and enjoyment of the above lands during my life and until my death should be suggested at the discretion of my said wife during her infancy - My three Children Elizabeth, Susan, John their and Mary Ann having been before provided for my Will and desire is that they should have no part of the property I now possess except an equal proportion of the property above held to my wife after her decease.

Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my son William L. Brown one Negro Girl now in his possession named Fanny & her increase to him his heirs & assigns forever.

Item 3^d I give and bequeath to my son John Brown one Negro Girl named Charity and her future increase to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my son Alfred Brown one Negro Girl named Peter to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my son Michaela Brown one Negro Girl named Mary with her future increase to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item 6th I give and bequeath to my son Henry Brown one Negro Girl named Sarah and her future increase to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item 7th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Ann Brown one Negro Girl named Jane with her future increase and one Negro Girl named Mary to her heirs and assigns forever.

Item 8th I give and bequeath to my son Samuel Washington Brown one small Negro Girl named Henry and Wesley to him his heirs and assigns forever. My Will and desire is that my Negro woman Mary and her future increase should be sold immediately after my decease and my share and half as a portion to be needed not mentioned here but may be applied at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and the money arising from the sale of the above named woman Mary and her future increase should be paid to my son Samuel Washington Brown and his heirs and assigns forever.
