In the name of God, Amen, I, Abraham Gepell of Franklin County, being weak in body but of disposing mind and memory calling to mind the certainty of Death and the uncertainty of Life and being desirous to dispose of such worldly goods as it has pleased God to bless me with do make my last Will and Testament in the following manner that is - say, first of all, I desire that all my just debts be paid and to enable my Executor to comply with this part of my Will I desire that my Executor shall sell all my lands that I own or possess, and out of the money arising from such sale or sales first to pay all my just debts, and the balance of the monies arising from the sale of my Lands to go to my beloved wife, to be enjoyed by her till my Daughter Catharine Gepell shall arrive to the age of Eighteen Years, at which time my Will is that all my Estate go to my Daughter Catharine Gepell to be enjoyed by her for ever, and do hereby empower my Executor to sell my Lands and make Deeds to the same, and lastly I appoint my beloved friends Joseph Flora & George Kase Executors to this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 5 day of January 1821.
