In the name of God I Adam Ryherd of the County of Franklin and State of Virginia being old & infirm thought of sound memory cautioning to mind the certainty of death and the uncertainty of like to make this my last Will and Testament in the first place I do commit my soul to God who gave it me, and my body to the dirt from whence it came desiring my body to be buried in a christian like manner according to my worldly goods which God has ble^d me with after paying all my just debts and burial expenses I do leave with my wife for her benefit during her natural life the whole of my Estate both real and personal and after her death the remaining part to be sold for the best price it will bring and equally divided between all my children except my Daughter Barbara Ryherd late Barbara Arthur (Wife) to my son Peter Ryherd, Lewis Ryherd, Jacob Ryherd, Mary Ryherd late Mary Hepler, Elizabeth Ryherd late Elizabeth Porman Katherin Ryherd late Katherin Stevenson, Eve Ryherd late Eve Stevenson Peggy Ryherd late Peggy Webster, Abolmar Ryherd late Abolmar Dellow. Thirdly I do give to my daughter Barbara Ryherd late Barbara Arthur one dollar as her part for reasons best known to myself Also I do appoint Peter Stevenson my good friend my Executor to act and transact all my business the Witness hereof I set my hand and affix my seal this 15th June 1819
