Stockton one of the Executors herein named and proved by the oaths of John Cook, Pleasant Dickinson and Peter Campbell three of the Witnesses hereto and ordered to be Recorded. And on the motion of the said Peter S. Stockton who took the oath prescribed by Law and together with Pleasant Dickinson and Christopher Wingfield his securities entered into and acknowledged their Bond in the Penalty of ten Thousand Dollars conditional as the Law directs, Certificate is granted him for Obtaining a Probate in due form, liberty being reserved to Elizabeth Stockton Executrix and Christopher Wingfield, Robert Innis and Benjamin Cook the other Executors in the said Will named to join in the Probate when they shall think fit.

It is also my Will & desire that my

dispose of her part of my Estate that I have given to her and she may please after her dec^d. This is my Last Will & Testament revoking all other wills heretofore made, as witness my hand & affix^d my Seal this 4th day of May 1814.
