I give and bequeath unto David Real my dearly and beloved son the third part of my whole and personally Estate David Real his part of the Estate the money is to be put to Interest till he becomes twenty one years of age he is to have a horse saddle and bridle equal to Henry's in worth to be his right and property when he comes of age. John Snowles and Henry Real of whom I like wise constitute make and Ordain the sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament and singular whole and personal of my Estate and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former Testaments, Wills, Legacies, bequests and executors legacies in any wise named, willed, and bequeathed, Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my Will and Testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand seal this eighteenth day of January in the year of our Lord an thousand eight hundred and eighteen, the forty second of the Commonwealth.
