

Thirdly I give & bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Barbary Webb the Tract of Land whereon I live containing Two hundred and twenty acres, more or less, also one half of my Stock & the one half of my house hold furniture to her & her heirs forever. Fourthly I give and bequeath unto My second Wife Daughter Mary Rogers the other half of all my Stock & her hold furniture to her & her heirs forever, all & lastly I nominate constitute & appoint my Trusty friends Swainfield Hill and his Son John Hill Executors to this my Last Will & Testament Signed & acknowledged this twenty seventh day of June 1797

Gearhart and Mary Gearhart, and I further desire and appoint my Brother Valentine Gearhart to be my Executor, to act and do with my Estate according to this my Will & Testament
