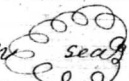

In the name of God amen, I, Andrew Thompson of the County of Franklin & Parish of Patrick being rather indisposed in Body, but of sound mind & memory do make this my Last Will and Testament hereby revoking disannulling & making void all former Wills by me made, in the first place, I recommend My soul to God who gave it to me, and secondly my body to the earth to be decently Buried. Thirdly I give & bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Barbary Webb the Tract of Land whereon I live containing Two hundred and twenty acres, more or less, also one half of my Stock & the one half of my house hold furniture to her & her heirs forever. Fourthly I give and bequeath unto My second Wife Daughter Mary Rogers the other half of all my Stock & her household furniture to her & her heirs forever, and lastly I nominate constitute & appoint my Trusty friends Swinfield Hill and his Son John Hill Executors to this my Last Will & Testament Signed & acknowledged this twenty seventh day of June 1797

I William Gearhart of the County of Franklin and State of Virginia being very weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for his mercies and calling to mind that it is appointed for all overt to die, do make & ordain this my Last Will & Testament, and first of all I desire that the Tract of Land I now live on be sold to satisfy my lawful Debts, and if that will not be sufficient I desire the Remainder to be paid out my other property, and further I bequeath unto my dearly beloved Wife Elizabeth all other moveable property for the support and maintenance of my children, together with a Tract of Land lying in Montgomery County, on the Waters of Little River to be in her hands till such time as the children comes of age, and then the Land to be sold and Divided between my children, my Wife first taking her thirds, the Rest to be divided equally between my children John W. Gearhart and Mary Gearhart, and I further desire and appoint my Brother Valentine Gearhart to be my Executor, to act and do with my Estate according to this my Will & Testament.
