 County being low in body but of sound mind and perfect memory, thought
 proper to make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form
 following, and first I recommend my Soul to God who gave it my body to
 the Earth from whence it was taken to be buried at the discretion of my
 Executors after named, and touching my Worlly Estate, First I desire all
 my just debts shall be paid. Secondly I desire my dear and loving Wife
 may live on the Lound and Plantation where I now live and enjoy all
 my Estate both real and personally during her Widowhood, and at
 her death, or marriage I desire my Lands may be equally divided amongst
 my Sons, giving the youngest the place I now live on, the next youngest
 the place nearest to it, and so on to the eldest. and I desire my Daughter
 Mary Holland shall have other property equal in Value to one of their
 shares of Land; Also I give to my Sons Austin and Thomas Holland the
 Horses that has been called theirs, and desire the rest of my Children may have
 as they come of age. a Horse of equal value a piece, the rest of my Estate I
 desire may be sold and equally divided amongst my Sons and daughter.
 And I do hereby constitute my brothers Peter and Thomas Holland Executors
 to this my last Will and Testament, and revoking all others declare this to be
 my Last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and affixed my Seal. this twenty eighth day of October in the year
 of our Lord eighteen hundred and ^{thirteen}

An account held for Franklin County at the Courthouse the 2^d day of February
 1801. This last Will and Testament of Asa Holland deceased was produced
 in Court by Peter Holland and Thomas Holland the Executors herein named
 proved by the oath of Elisha Lax and John Forbes two of the subscribing
 Witnesses and ordered to be recorded. and in the motion of the said executors
 who made oath as the Law directs and together with Thomas Lamp,
 Samuel Cockrow, and Aquilla Rivers their securities executed bonds in the
 penalty of one thousand five hundred pounds conditioned according to Law
 certificate is granted them for obtaining a Probate in due form.
