In the name of God Amen I Benjamin Dwale of the County of
Franklin and State of Virginia am now in a low state of health though in perfect
Mumny do declare this to be my last will and Testament first of all I give my soul
to god who first give it to me and my Body to the Ground to be Buried at
the Discretion of my Executors in full Assurance of the Resurrection as for the
Worldly Goods which it hath pleased the Almighty God to Bless me with I
dispose of them in the following Manner to wit I give my son Lewis Dwale
five Shillings to be Liv^y of my Estate and I give and Bequeath five Shillings to be paid
to Benjamin Menner Dwale I also give and Bequeath five Shillings to be paid
to him in the like Manner I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Estabank
five Shillings to be paid to her as to the Others to Rebecca Murch I give and
Bequeath one horse and Cart to be Delivered to her out of my Stock my land
whereon I now live to the New line I give and Bequeath to my son Marson
Dwale and his Heirs and the Remainder part of the said tract to my
Daughter Nancy Skinner Robertson and her Heirs. and also to my wife
Daughter Nancy Skinner Robertson I give and Bequeath my feather Bed
all my Proppertys I leave to my dear Wife in clearing her and after her
Decease to my son Marson Dwale I will and Appoint my son Marson
Dwale to be my Executor and no other In witness whereof the said
