Albright

In the name of God amen, I Casper Albright of Franklin County being awake in body, tho, of sound mind and perfect memory, thought proper to make this my last Will & Testament in manner and form following, to wit. First I desire all my just debts shall be paid. Secondly I desire my dear and loving wife Mary, keep my Estate both real & personal during her natural life or Widow hood, and at her death or marriage, I desire the same may be equally divided among my five children, John Albright, Sarah Albright, Nancy Albright, William Albright and Betsey Albright on their giving my son Henry Albright four dollars. and I desire if my wife is now pregnant, and is delivered of a son or daughter, it may have an equal share with the other five children first above mentioned, and it is also my desire that when my children arrive ^{aged} to Lawful age, or marry, they may have their shares, if the family can spare it or part thereof on their giving a receipt for what they receive. And I do hereby constitute & appoint my friends Robert Casley & Thomas Chaute Executors to this my last Will and Testament, and revoking all others. declare this to be my last Will and Testament, and desire it may be received as such. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this fifteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and three.
