In the name of God Amen, the day of _____ 1802 I Charles Wray sen^r of Franklin County being sick in body but of good and sound memory and thanks be to almighty God, and calling to remembrance the uncertain state of this transitory life, and that all flesh must yield to death, whom it shall please God to call, do make, constitute, or join, and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, revoking & annulling by these Presents, all and every Testament, Will, and Wills heretofore by me made, and declared either by word, or writing, and this is to be taken only for my last Will and Testament, and none other, and first being penitent, and sorry from my heart for my sins past, most humbly desire forgiveness for the same. I give, I commit my soul unto almighty God, my Saviour and Redeemer, in whom and by merits of Jesus Christ I trust and believe assuredly to be saved and to have full Remission and forgiveness of all my sins, and that my soul with my body at a general day of Resurrection shall rise again with joy and through the merits of Christ's death and passion, possess and inherit the Kingdom of Heaven prepared for his Elect and chosen, and my body to be buried in such place where it shall please my Executors hereafter named to appoint; and for the settling of my temporal Estates and goods, and chattels and debts as it hath pleased God far above my merits to bestow upon me, I do order, give and dispose the same in manner here following: That is to say, first I will that all these debts and dues as I owe in right or conscience be paid within convenient time after my decease by my Executors hereafter named: Item, I give and bequeath to my son Charles Wray the Land on the South side of the Branch where he now lives for his share, and I give to my son Thomas Wray
