his heirs or assigns, forever, I also give, him, nine hundred and, thirty three
acres of Land, adjoining, the last mentioned, patented in my own
name to him his heirs or assigns forever, I also give my son Robert Junes
my tract of Land on Montgomery County, known by the name of the
Lower Bottom, Laying on Blue Stone Creek to him his heirs or on assigns
for ever, 2^dly, my will and desire is that my Ex^{rs} hereafter, mentioned
do sell or much of my tract, of land, Laying on Elk horn, Creek Fayette
County state of Kentucky, as shall be sufficient to raise the sum of
three hundred and fifty pounds Cash to be disposed of in the manner,
as shall be here after mentioned, 3^dly I give my three sons viz Hugh
Junes Junes and Harry Junes all the remainder of my tract of Land on
Elk horn Creek Fayette County be Equally divided amongst them, to them
their & there heirs or assigns forever, I also give my three sons Last
named, undivided half of one tract of land Laying on Green River in the
State of Kentucky patented in the name of James Cowden, to Equally
divided amongst them to them, their heirs and assigns forever
4thly I give to my son Beardsall Junes, all my land on the South side of
the main Road leading to Henry Court house Laying on the Crab tree and
Grassy forks of Snow Creek to him his heirs and assigns forever also one hundred
acres of Land I bought of Paul Kitcherson to him his heirs and assigns
forever Reserving the use of the tract of Land I bought of Henry Rogers
late Sarah Turley during her natural life, I also give my said son Beardsall
Junes, three Negroes viz, Martin Philadelphia and Polly her with three In
crease to him his heirs and assigns forever also a Bed and furniture beside
the Bed he now has in use, two Cows and Calves two sows and Pigs
a plow horse worth fifteen pounds also twenty dollars worth of Plantations
Tools and household furniture and as much provisions as will last him a year
after he leaves this house at the discretion of my Ex^{rs} 5thly I Give to Sarah
Turley during her life the use of my negroe girl named Pat her death that
her Increase to Return to my Estate, and be divided as my former Negroes are
or were I also give the said Sarah Turley a cow and calf, a sow Pigs a horse
worth fifteen pounds and Provision to last for one year after she leaves
this house at the Discretion of my Ex^{rs}

6th I lend to my daughter Margt. M. Patterson my negroe girl named
belle Cousey, now in her possession I also lend her one negroe woman named
Helen to be delivered to her in a year after my decease, to keep them
during life and after her death, I give them with their increase to the heirs
of her body forever, but in case she should die, without surviving heirs of her
body, in that case the said negroe with increase to return to my Estate
and be divided as my other negroes are or were that is now left undivided,
I also give my said Daughter my young mare called pinnace a Bed
and furniture two Cows and Calves one hundred pounds in cash
to be paid her as soon as a sale of the part of my Elk Horn Lands
is made by my Ex^r as a fore mentioned 7th I give to my Daughter
Elizabeth Egglestone Jones three negroe viz viz Cole meal anney &
Kit, to her, her heirs or assigns forever, also a Horse & Saddle worth
Twenty five pounds to be delivered her when she comes to the age of
Eighteen, or sooner if my Ex^r shall think proper also two Cows & Calves
and one feather Bed and furniture - further as soon as the
Land on Elk Horn Creek near Hartstucky which is to raise the
three hundred fifty pounds as afore mentioned is sold and the
Money Recd, my will and Desire is that my Ex^r place out at
Interest, two hundred fifty pounds for the Benefit of my said
Daughter, the Interest of said sum to go towards her support and
Education & when she shall arrive at the age of Eighteen or is married
the above sum of two hundred fifty pounds is to be paid her with
any Arrearages, that may due thereon, 8th my will is that my two
Hundred acres of Land lying in Barrenboro County, on the waters of Pickens
Creek State of Kentucky be sold by my Ex^r and the money arising from
the sale one half to be paid to my son Hugh Jones in order to support
him and finish his Education the other half the money to be applied by my Ex^r
to wards Educating & bringing up my son Harry Jones 9th my will & Desire is
that my tract of land in Patrick County of one hundred and fifty acres with the
unfinished Survey, adjoining the lands of Richard Mitchell and Col Gordons lies
in Franklin County, be sold by my Ex^r and the money arising from the sale
to go towards the support of my son James Jones in what necessities he may
want and to finish his Education I also give him a horse & saddle worth
twenty five pounds to be delivered him by my Ex^r when he shall arrive
at the age of Eighteen 10th further my Desire is that after my Death
as soon as possible that all the debts due me by bills bonds open accounts or
otherwise, be collected and out of the money arising therefrom pay all
my last Debts -

 Disposed of to be Equally Divided, amongst, my, four sons, Viz. Robert
 James Hugh James, James James and Harry James and Lastly I
 hereby Constitute and appoint my Friends Samuel Calcutt & Harry James
 of the State of Kentucky, and my son Robert James Esq. of this
